## Catholic Charities DC Successfully Completes Its Largest Fundraising Campaign

More than \$100 million is raised to sustain a mission of serving the poor

**WASHINGTON, Nov. 1, 2021** — Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Washington has exceeded its ambitious fundraising goal of \$100 million in a campaign that will allow the social services agency to strengthen its current work and plan for the future.

President and CEO <u>Msgr. John J. Enzler</u> made the announcement at a reception for leading donors. "The response to this campaign has been truly extraordinary — particularly as it took place during a pandemic when many of us wondered about the state and future of the economy," he said.

Father Enzler extended his thanks to a group of <u>dedicated supporters</u> who led the <u>"Our Community. Our Commitment. Our Legacy."</u> campaign, members of Catholic Charities Board of Directors and the hundreds of individuals and organizations who made gifts.

"Without you, we could not say 'Yes' to the 235,000 people who come to us each year for help and hope," he said. "Without you, we could not ensure a legacy of service and the sustainability of Catholic Charities."

More than 115 young professionals who make up the new <u>83.33 Society</u> were among those contributing to the campaign. With recurring monthly gifts of \$83.33 over five years, members are the new generation of Catholic Charities supporters.

The campaign bolsters three priorities by investing in more than 50 existing programs, increasing Catholic Charities' endowment, and funding the launch of the Newcomer Network to improve the lives of vulnerable immigrants in the region.

More than \$21 million was raised for the Newcomer Network, 41 percent over its goal of \$15 million. Begun in 2020 with a generous commitment from the A. James & Alice B. Clark Foundation, the Newcomer Network provides immigration legal services and integrated social services to newcomers to the community. In its first six months, the program provided services to 1,235 people in Montgomery and Prince George's counties.

Among other contributions to the campaign are \$16 million in legacy gifts, which will support programs into the future.

"The campaign was an eye toward the future, and I'm very pleased to say that the results ensure sustainability for Catholic Charities," said Robert Trone, who served as chair of the campaign

with his wife, Anna. "Catholic Charities' programs are the most effective and efficient for giving back to the community that I've ever seen, and the campaign results will have a lasting positive impact on them."
