

#### Dear Parents/Families/Guardians & Program Supporters,

The fall season has arrived, including the changing temperatures resulting in some warm and chilly days; as well as the beautiful colorful tree leaves! As we look forward to the Thanksgiving break, all are encouraged to stop for a moment and reflect upon all that you are thankful for. October and November have been busy months for us as you will see as you review this publication of our bi-monthly newsletter. I am thankful for our dedicated staff who commit themselves daily to the mission and vision, for our students who embody it, and for our parents and family members who trust us and partners with us to support and promote their students' achievements.

Here at Kennedy School October and November have been busy months for us. During both months our students and staff attended a variety of field trips, volunteer experiences, various Special Olympic events; we honored and celebrated our monthly student and staff award recipients and birthday honorees. During October we celebrated National Hispanic Heritage month and in November Native American Heritage month. Below are some important reminders to keep in mind regarding Kennedy School Expectations:

- Effective December 9th, any students whose health and immunization records are not current will not be admitted to school. Please ensure all requested information so that your child does not have to miss any school days. Notification has been provided by our nurses. This district mandate must be followed. Should you need information about free clinics, please let a staff member know so we may provide you that information.
- ✓ Students must be on time daily (8:45 a.m. to 2:45 p.m.) If your child arrives after 8:45 they are late. Half days count as well, students should be present. Please communicate with us regarding Transportation, etc., we can assist with tracking/documentation and mark missed days as excused. Report all issues/complaints to the OSSE transportation hotline at 202-5760-5000. Excuse notes must be provided immediately following a student's absence. We are mandated to follow the district's truancy policies.
- Please closely monitor your students social media involvement outside of school, incidents are occurring which are entering the school environment and are continuing to cause issues. This is why we do not allow our students to carry their phones during the school day and why they are closely monitored when using school computers. Inappropriate use of cell phones, computers, and social media are a safety issue, and we encourage home rules and monitoring at home.
- Ensure that students complete their homework and if you have questions about assignment(s) contact teacher(s)
- ✓ Temperatures are changing so please see attached uniform flyer and ensure your child has the appropriate uniform. If you need assistance with uniforms, please contact us.

The 2nd quarter of the school year has begun. Schoolwide expectations are set every day, to promote good decision making and exhibition of our school mantra from all students; we ask that you too promote this. Do not hesitate to reach out if you have any questions or concerns. As always thanks for partnering with us because Parents/Guardians + Educators working in partnership = Successful Students







- ✓ U.S. Botanic Garden (Nov. 28 Jan. 5): The 2024 edition features five G-gauge model trains circulating through oversized animal pollinators made from plant parts.
